The Hockey Canada Foundation Assist Fund was created in response to the many families experiencing financial challenges. The goal of the Fund is to help Canadian youth access hockey and play the game they love.

The Assist Fund will provide up to \$500 per player in registration fee subsidies to approved applicants who are registered with a Hockey Canadasanctioned association. For the 2024-25 season, the Assist Fund commits to providing \$1 million/2,000 assists to kids across Canada to help them access hockey.

Since 2020, the Hockey Canada Foundation Assist Fund has granted over 3.8 million dollars and has given over 8,558 assists.

MEMBER GUIDE HOW TO QUALIFY

Applications are submitted through the Spordle portal and require review to determine if applicant is eligible to receive funding. To qualify for an Assist, applicants must meet the following criteria:

- 1. **Financial qualification**: Applicants (as defined by the Canada Revenue Agency) who currently meet the LICO (low-income cutoff) as established by Stats Canada.
- 2. **Registration fee qualification**: Applicants must be registered with a Hockey Canada-sanctioned local hockey association (LHA) for the current season.

Applicants will receive an email within three to five business days of applying indicating if their application has been approved or declined.

HOW TO APPLY

The Assist Fund portal for the 2024-25 season will open on August 1st. The Assist Fund will grant up to \$1 million for the 2024-25 season. Once this limit has been reached, the Assist Fund application portal will be closed and no further applications will be accepted for the remainder of the season. In addition, any applications which were submitted but were not assessed prior to the limit being reached will not be approved, regardless of whether they would have otherwise met HCF's eligibility criteria. Desired applicants may apply through our Spordle portal linked here.

To apply, you will need to fill out an online form and provide a few documents to demonstrate your financial and registration fee qualifications. See photo samples below.

For **Financial Qualification**, please provide proof of total family annual income for that respective year. This could include your Canada Child

Benefit (CCB), or last year's Notice of Assessment (NOA) Line 15,000 for income earning family members.



For Registration Fee Qualification, please provide proof of Minor Hockey **Association Registration or official quote from Minor Hockey Association** you plan to register your kids. Once you have applied for an Assist, you can **NOT** switch your association.



You will also need to disclose if you've applied for other funding.

MEMBER GUIDE PAYMENT PROCESS

The Assist Fund is currently in the process of transitioning to a fully electronic payment system via Direct Deposit or E-Transfer. MHAs may input their Direct Deposit or E-Transfer information via the links below.

- 1. Finance Manager will pull Finance report indicating which MHAs need to be paid.
 - a. If EFT/E-Transfer information is available in payment processing system (NAV), payment is issued electronically.
 - b. If EFT/E-Transfer information has not been provided, payment is issued by cheque and will be mailed to corresponding member. See below for additional information.
- 2. **Finance Manager** issues EFT or E-Transfer payment. See schedule for set dates.
 - a. Payment will include label indicating it is from Hockey Canada Foundation Assist Fund.
 - b. An automated email remittance will be sent to the corresponding association and will include a statement with applicant names and approved funds.
- 3. MHA Statements are automatically e-mailed through Spordle to individual MHAs.

If EFT or E-transfer information is not available, funds will be printed by cheque and mailed to corresponding Member.

- 1. **Finance Manager** runs payment report from Spordle portal.
- 2. **Executive Director** approves payment report by e-mail.

- 3. **Finance Manager** issues cheques to be mailed to Member (cheques statements include applicant names and funds per applicant) and Accounts Payable Coordinator will print cheques.
- 4. Accounts Payable Coordinator will print AF Payment Cheques from Calgary Office.
- 5. Cheques need to be signed by **Finance Director**.
- 6. Signed cheques are prepared for mailing to Member Branch by Office Coordinator.
- 7. MHA Statements are automatically e-mailed through Spordle on set date.
- 8. Finance Manager reconciles all cheque payments to identify deposited/uncashed cheques by February 15 2025.
 - a. If any cheques have not been deposited, Finance Manager is to notify HCF Coordinator and HCF Executive Director by providing a reconciliation report which includes all uncashed cheques.
 - b. HCF Executive Director notifies the Members' Executive Directors and **METs** about uncashed cheques.

COMMON QUESTIONS AND SCENARIOS

1. How does a parent receive the funding?

- a. If an applicant has already paid for registration, the MHA should refund the parent for the amount of the grant when they receive our statement.
- b. If an applicant informs the MHA they are applying for funding, the MHA should credit the account once the applicant receives approval.
- c. PLEASE NOTE: Confirmation from Hockey Canada should be treated as guaranteed funds. No child should be withheld from the ice and no parent should be withheld their refund once an Assist Fund application has been accepted.

2. What happens if an applicant receives funding exceeding their registration cost?

If an applicant's funding exceeds their registration cost, or if they receive additional funding causing the grant to exceed registration cost, the MHA must notify the Assist Fund via email – assistfund@hockeycanada.ca. The MHA may then return the funds via e-transfer -rsavoy@hockeycanada.ca.

3. Can a child switch MHAs?

Once a child is approved for an Assist, they may not change their MHA.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What is the Hockey Canada Foundation Assist Fund?

The Hockey Canada Foundation Assist Fund was created in 2020 to provide financial support to Canadian youth who want to play hockey and break barriers.

The fund will provide up to \$500 per youth player in registration fee subsidies for financially-qualified applicants registered with a sanctioned Hockey Canada association.

Canadians can also make a donation to the Assist Fund to support the game in their community. 100% of all donations will go to supporting access to hockey.

Who qualifies for Hockey Canada Foundation Assist Fund?

- -Financial Qualification: The Hockey Canada Foundation Assist Fund is open to applicants (as defined by the Canada Revenue Agency) who currently meet the LICO (low income cutoff) as established by Stats Canada.
- -Registration Fee Qualification: Applicants must be registering a child with a Hockey Canada-sanctioned local hockey association (LHA) for the 2024-25 season.
- -Age: U7-U18 see chart HERE.

What is required to apply for the Hockey Canada Foundation Assist Fund?

To apply, you will need to fill out an online form and provide a few documents to demonstrate your financial and registration fee qualifications.

For **financial qualification**, please provide proof of total family annual income for that respective year. This could include your Canada Child Benefit (CCB), or last year's Notice of Assessment (NOA) Line 15,000 for income earning family members.

For Registration Fee Qualification, please provide proof of Minor Hockey Association Registration or official quote from Minor Hockey Association you plan to register your kids.

PLEASE NOTE: Once you have applied for an assist, you can **NOT** switch your association.



You will also need to disclose if you've applied for other funding.

What does "Hockey Canada-sanctioned" mean?

Hockey Canada-sanctioned includes all hockey programming offered by Hockey Canada, its Members, Local Hockey Associations, Partners, Hockey Canada Schools with

Residence, Hockey Canada Accredited Schools or any other organization under the auspices of Hockey Canada.

How much funding will applicants receive?

Each approved applicant will receive up to \$500 per player in funding that will only go toward registration fees with a sanctioned Hockey Canada association.

When will applicants receive their funding?

Funding for approved applicants will be sent to their Hockey Canada-sanctioned local hockey association (LHA), which will then apply the funds to the applicant's registration fees. Processing of requests and approvals should range from two to four weeks (subject to volume of requests). Disbursement of funds will vary by LHA – please contact your LHA directly.

How long is the Fund accepting applications for the 2024-25 season?

The Hockey Canada Foundation Assist Fund will be open to receive applications starting August 1, 2024 and will remain opened until \$1 million of assists have been accepted. Only applications that are submitted with sufficient documentation will be processed and all applications will be assessed on a first come, first served basis. Once this limit has been reached, the Assist Fund application portal will be closed and no further applications will be accepted for the remainder of the season. In addition, any applications which were submitted but were not assessed prior to the limit being reached will not be approved, regardless of whether they would have otherwise met HCF's eligibility criteria.

How are funds being allocated?

To ensure equity, we will allocate \$10,000 per Member. Funds will then be distributed on a first come, first served basis. The Hockey Canada Foundation works hard year-round with a goal to ensure funds are available to meet the demand from coast to coast.

Can I donate to the Assist Fund?

Yes, please! When it's time to play, we all need an assist. More donations made to the Hockey Canada Foundation Assist Fund mean more young Canadians can enjoy the game they love.

How much of my donation goes to helping Canadians?

Hockey Canada covers all costs associated with the administration of the Assist Fund so 100% of all donations made assist Canadian youth as they get back to playing hockey.

Will I receive a tax receipt for my donation?

A tax receipt will be issued for all personal donations of more than \$20.
